## 2012

Started helping other companies to manage and mitigate the impact of the HIV/AIDS epidemic through a variety of governance, assessment, surveillance, planning and monitoring strategies

Improved current HIV, AIDS, STI and TB information and behaviour change education by providing each Roadside Wellness Centre with an A1 laminated training set

Implementation of the Wellness Committee

PIMA machines were provided to all 22 Roadside Wellness Centres

Established a Peer Education programme within commercial sex worker communities surrounding Wellness Centres, companies and at Wellness Centres themselves

Re-launch of the Port Elizabeth roadside wellness centre

HIV counselling and testing course was provided for Mobile Wellness Centre drivers

Participated in the International World AIDS conference in Washington DC

Participated in the National Department of Health key populations workshop at the Health Department in Pretoria

The CEP facilitated a Wellness Centre workshop for all clinical employees

## 2013

## 2014

## 2015
